

2010 – 2011 Most Endangered Places

Fort Bayard, Highway 180, Grant County

- 704 acre site adjacent to Fort Bayard National Cemetery and Gila National Forest, and nearby Freeport MacMoRan Copper and Gold, Inc. copper mine.
- Fort established 1865; transformed into US Army hospital in 1900 for treatment of TB; 1922 until 1965 Veteran's Hospital #55; 1965 – 2004, state facility for long term care patients; 2004, vacated.
- New Mexico Historic District, 2001; National Historic Landmark in 2004.
- Owned by state of NM and managed by Property Control Division under GSA.
- Several of the buildings including the 1939 Theater Building have been restored.
- Vacant buildings subject to vandalism and deferred maintenance.
