

2010—2011 Most Endangered Places

The Twine House, Palluche Canyon, Rio Arriba County

- Twine House LA127737; New Mexico State Land Office, owner
- Constructed AD 1727 (dated by tree-ring samples)
- Classic example of Navajo defensive *pueblito*, including evidence of interior wall plaster, loop holes, off-set doorways, and *in situ* roof beams.
- Located atop large boulder for defensive purposes.
- Exposed to elements and roofless.
- Needs stabilization before collapse is complete.
